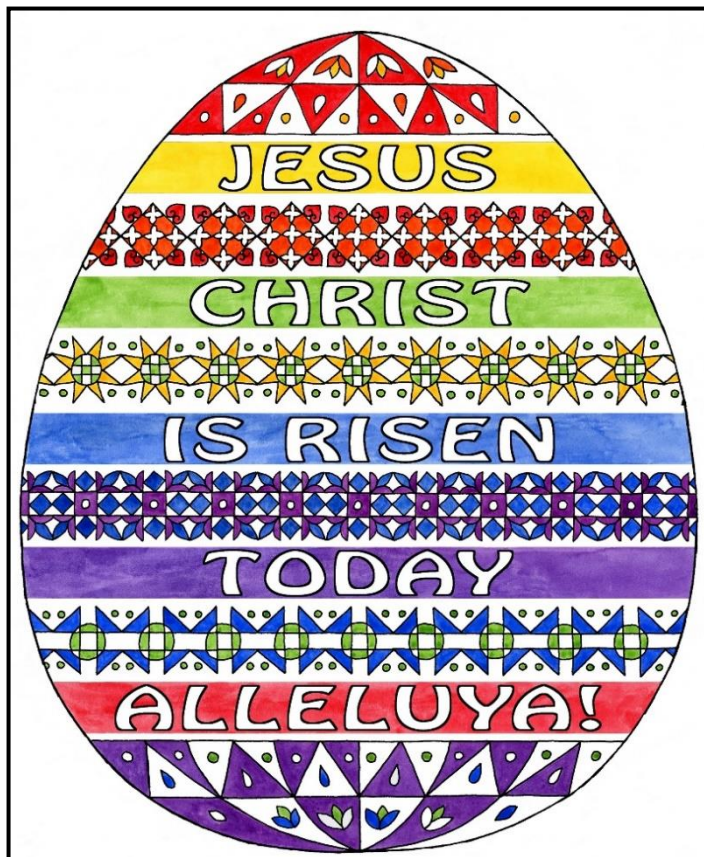

Vicar's Letter

It's a pleasure this month for me to make way for an introductory letter from Scott Lunn, who on June 28th will be ordained Deacon in the Church of England in Wakefield cathedral, before joining us as a part time Curate 😊.

...What a strange but wonderful task this is: to write a short self-introduction to the communities of The Penhill Benefice. I have the privilege of joining your worshipping community at the end of June. Whilst



there are different aspects and reasons for looking forward to this, the primary blessing is in joining the church communities in Wensleydale that from generation to generation have offered a welcome and common call to the love of God in Christ Jesus. When our Church is under strain, as it is just now, we are reminded of the value of the ongoing presence of the church in the dale; it is a value I do not take for granted.

Twenty-five years ago, I was given a welcome at the church in Richmond. Two years ago, I was welcomed afresh at Middleham (as an ordinand on placement, and member of the worshipping community). There is enormous value in the welcome being offered to me by The Penhill Benefice, not least because of the hard work, sacrifices and love that have ensured the churches' continuity through the generations. That work, love, and commitment continues afresh today. I do not underestimate the value of people simply turning up Sunday-by-Sunday, when we are able, as even if this is all that we do it is an essential encouragement to others.

I also come to join you as a curate. This too, as I write this, seems strange and wonderful as my ordination, in Wakefield, is not until the end of June. Whilst each believer's story is unique my new identity as 'curate' will have some notable characteristics: I will be SSM (self-supporting minister), as is Penny; I will part time with half my life committed to church work and half

my life continuing as a mathematics teacher at Richmond School and Sixth Form (those of you with longer memories may remember me working at The Wensleydale School and Sixth Form); I am 53 years old, which is very much at the older end of those being ordained this summer.

Some of you may have met my lovely wife Gillian; originally from Gourock but now finishing her third year of curacy at Leyburn and Bellerby. We have three grown up children: Helen (previous Alastair) who begins an organ apprenticeship at Chelmsford Cathedral in September, James studying Mathematics at Sheffield, and Andrew finishing his studies at Richmond School before heading off to London with his trombone. And we have Benji, our dog, who is an eleven-year-old Springador.

As someone who loves to sing and play the piano, I am looking forward to hearing more of the concerts held in the benefice. And it is very possible we have passed each other when I have been out-and-about on my bicycle in the beauty that we share in both Wensleydale and Swaledale.

There's much more I could add but suffice to express my sense of excitement and privilege at the prospect of getting out-and-about in the benefice and hearing your stories and perspectives!

We worship Christ who is the Suffering Servant and so alongside the beauty around and within we acknowledge the deep challenges we face in life's seasons. My prayer is to serve and support whilst having the wisdom to know when I am in need of help from others. Alongside my ministry as a Reader (LLM) since 2000 a distinctive aspect of my ministry is working alongside our Church's Survivor Engagement team as well as some of the work of our National Safeguarding Team (NST). It is a busy time.

I was asked, recently, by our Diocesan Director of Vocations how I imagined my role as a curate within the Penhill Benefice. "I don't know", was my honest answer. We don't write the script. We can and do, however, dedicate ourselves to God in worship, love and hard work. Our prayer is that in journeying together, committing ourselves to each other, and sharing stories, we will always be following the guidance of our living God. There

will be both blessing and challenges but through all our loving and living and learning together we grow deeper in the knowledge that

“in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.” Romans 8:37-39. *Mr. Scott Lunn.*

At the service she encouraged the congregation to campaign for justice by following the example of William Wilberforce who fought for the abolition of slavery in Britain.

She called for Christians to be a people of courage and faith. 'Being a Christian is not about fighting temptation by hating

ourselves or by rejecting parts of ourselves. Being a Christian is about celebrating what God has created us to be and what God has given us. It is in Him that we have our identity and our sense of security.'

She said Jesus had repeatedly stressed that love, joy and justice is for everyone. She thanked the benefice for supporting Christian Aid, 'The support you give to Christian Aid allows that love, that justice and that joy to break through into the lives of others.'

Dying Crops Means Food Stops



In Guatemala, the climate crisis is killing Amelia's precious crops. She relies on the land to feed her eight-year-old son, Lázaro, and four-year-old daughter, Yakelin.

A river passes through Amelia's farm, but deadly heatwaves are causing it to run dangerously low.

Both communities and crops stand to lose life-giving water.

The cruel injustice is that Indigenous communities like Amelia's have done the least to cause the climate crisis, yet they endure its impact the most. As their farms are devastated, the search for solutions becomes critical. Amelia's hopeful that she can combat extreme weather by changing the way she farms. With the support of specialist training from our partner, Congcoop, Amelia's planting resilient crops, conserving water and making fertiliser.

Amelia's also a leader in her community, sharing her knowledge with other households, so that one day, no family will worry about their children going without food. This is the unstoppable power of Amelia's hope in action.

The Very Narrow Bridge of Life:

Stories Through the Church Year by Revd Peter Jenner

This is a book about finding joy in a world that sometimes seems difficult to navigate. Through a collection of engaging stories, which were originally delivered as sermons, Peter invites us to reflect on our own faith journey and encourages us to be 'fully part of the adventure of life...appreciative of God's creation, of human interaction and delighting in what is and ought to be.' Peter died shortly after retiring, and during his final months the book was edited by Louise Redshaw who lives in Carperby.

Profits from the sale of the book will be shared between St Andrew's Church and the Stuart Warren Foundation which supports a PhD student from the South African Region to study Chemistry at the University of Cambridge.

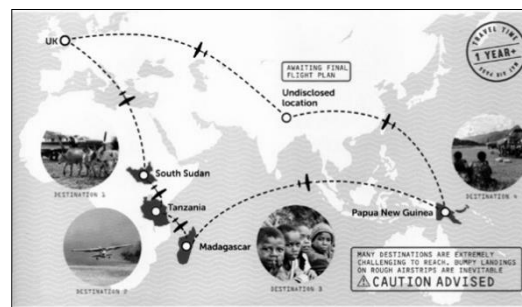

Journey with MAF. Last month we travelled to South Sudan as that was the region where MAF began flying. We found that the need for their aircraft



continues to be just as great today. The pilot on that first journey was Jack Hemmings. This year we celebrate 80 years of MAF's humanitarian flights. 135 aircraft now bring help and hope to the world's poorest and remotest people in 1,400 destinations in 26 countries. The

celebrations begin on a note of sadness as Jack Hemmings, the last surviving MAF founder passed away on 24th January aged 103 years.

Our journey with MAF continues from South Sudan to Tanzania. MAF began flying into Tanzania in 1959. The country has a population of 59 million, life expectancy is 63.9 years and over 117 indigenous languages are spoken. The climate is tropical with two unpredictable rainy seasons. In the wettest times the roads are impassable even for motorbikes and in the dry times there is often drought and food shortages. 35% of the population lack adequate sanitation facilities and 38% of the children are malnourished. Conflict in neighbouring DRC and Burundi have culminated in over 300,000 refugees fleeing to Tanzania.

MAF has helped construct 31 airstrips to transport needed supplies, development specialists, educational workers and pastors across the country

using 3 Cessna 206 aircraft. MAF pilots carried around 1,000 passengers and flew 38,000 miles in one year. Despite its inadequate transport system, Tanzania has many natural attractions which have become major sources of income, namely the Serengeti National Park with its wild animals and Mount Kilimanjaro, 19,341 feet. MAF planes flying out of Arusha can see the snow-clad summit. Arusha is famed for the vibrant colours of its markets, exotic spices and fresh produce. However, efforts to resolve Tanzania's hunger crisis by boosting agriculture are constantly being hampered by the unpredictable rainfall and drought. MAF is supporting a 5-year Food for Life project run by World Relief in Tanzania. The initiative will benefit 7,500 subsistence farmers and their families offering training in techniques and soil management in the hope of doubling the harvest yield.

Martha Katau is an educated Maasai woman who has made an important contribution to MAF's work in the south Maasai region. She has helped local pastors, medics and NGO workers reach out to her people. Her focus has been on breaking the cycle of oppression against illiterate young women by the power of education, helping pregnant women and children access healthcare and bringing them opportunities to share the Gospel. For many their hope is deeply linked to the presence of MAF bringing them the services that are needed. Martha has built that bridge.

Stewart Ayling, formerly in Formula 1 motor racing, felt God was directing him to serve with MAF. Today he is Country Director for MAF Tanzania and leads a team of seven international and national staff. Pray for Stewart and his team and his family in this work.

One of Tanzania's most valuable assets is the warmth and hospitality of its people. Some of the best chapatis in Africa are cooked here. Why don't you try making some to serve with curry, and while you are kneading the dough pray for MAF in Tanzania bringing help and hope and God's love to its people. *Asante-sana (Swahili – thank you very much)*

Tanzanian Chapatis. **Ingredients:** 700g plain flour, 450ml warm water, 1 1/2 tsp salt, 4 tbsp vegetable oil. **Method:** Mix flour, salt, 3 tbsp oil and 350ml water. Keep adding water until dough is soft. Knead for 10/15 minutes. Divide into 10/12 portions, roll each into a ball, cover with cling film and rest for 10/12 minutes. Roll each ball out to 2.5cm thick in a circle. Brush top with oil. On medium heat cook each chapatti, brush top with oil and turn over. Cook for 30 seconds until golden brown.



Have you memories of the old Elm House Estate? We are collecting stories...

We are kicking off a small project delving into the history of the area on which now sits the Jonas Centre, Redmire.

At the Centre we regularly meet people who are coming back after it made a great impression on them when they stayed, attending a youth camp or for Christian fellowship. But the current set-up only covers the last 30 years. We want to go back further - we know God has been at work down the years in many different ways. We are already aware of at least two books that touch on the history, but we also want some local colour and a variety of perspectives.

As a volunteer at the Centre I have been surprised to come across villagers in Redmire and beyond who remember the estate from last century, under the series of previous owners, before it was divided into two separate ownerships. Some tell of playing in the grounds, having relatives who worked for the families who lived there, or attending informal worship and prayer, in the days when those with larger homes used to open them up for meetings. **Do you have a memory or story to tell?** (or do you know someone who has?).

**If you have recollections you'd like to share,
we'd be delighted to hear from you.**

Can you help? All it will involve is arranging to have a chat with me or another volunteer and choosing a (hopefully) encouraging story or two to put down on paper. This will then be added to other recollections, to go in our Jonas Centre "memories bank" to be kept for posterity.
