## Vicar's Letter

I write as the last of the early January snowfall is clinging to the tops – and it's a couple of weeks before we head into February.

Some people are glad that February is the shortest month – often a grim, bleak and grey time, either mucky or frozen, and best when it's gone. Alternatively, we can look for the positives and it can be entertaining to look up some February celebrations. While on 2nd February the churches will be marking Candlemas, 40 days since Christmas, it's also National Hedgehog Day – the European equivalent of the American 'Groundhog Day'. Hopefully our hedgehogs will sleep a little longer before risking our roads for another season! February 17th is apparently Random Acts of Kindness Day (see [randomactsofkindness.org](http://randomactsofkindness.org)) three days after a better known festival...

February famously has Valentine's Day at its mid-point. A day to celebrate those we love and make them feel special. Love, whether romantic love or in its wider expression is deeply spiritual as it takes us out of our preoccupation with ourselves to notice the other.

Jesus agreed with a man who summed up all the law of God in saying the greatest commandment is to love God, and to love our neighbour as ourselves. That little word 'as' teaches that we should indeed love and care for ourselves – but that we should love others equally ... and this all comes into focus as we live our lives loving and honouring God.

The man to whom Jesus spoke then responded, 'And who is my neighbour?' – leading Jesus to tell a famous story we know as 'The Good Samaritan' (see Luke's Gospel, chapter 10 from verse 25). The story affirms that anyone we see in need is our neighbour.

As February gives way to March, the first month of meteorological spring, so the church calendar leads us into Lent. Shrove Tuesday (Pancake Day) is on March 4th, leading to Ash Wednesday on 5th. You will read elsewhere in this issue of our opportunity to show concern for our neighbours internationally during Lent in our support for Christian Aid and their partner

organisations on the ground in such countries as South Sudan, Israel, the occupied Palestinian territories and Gaza. Their comprehensive website shows the breadth of their work and as Penny writes, we are very glad to have the Chair of Trustees of Christian Aid, the Bishop of London, Dame Sarah Mullally leading our service and preaching at St Andrew's church at 10.30 a.m. on Sunday March 9th.

Love expressed in practical help is something that will be written about in various ways in the Beacon during 2025. In a world too often blighted by selfishness and personal aggrandisement surely it must be our Christian response to counter this by choosing generosity and support for others as the part we can play to make the world a better place.

So, do enjoy February and its progression into March as we rehearse the great commandment and demonstrate love for all – whether strangers through Christian Aid, sweethearts, hedgehogs or in other acts of random kindness!

## Prayer Topics For February and March



We are blessed in this country to have seasons, meaning that there is a rhythm to the year, and the darkness of winter which many people find difficult begins to slowly dissipate in February with the early signs of Spring as bulbs start pushing up, and soon there will be lambs in the fields around us. It's perhaps a good time to re-set our individual and collective prayers, not only for ourselves but also for each other. Here are some suggestions:

**Mondays: Be thankful.** Take a little time to think about what you have – not just the material things but the people who are an important part of your life. How blessed do you feel by their friendship, their presence, their love? Perhaps you could tell them?

**Tuesdays: Be thoughtful.** What might you do for others? Could you offer to share some of your skills with others? If you think you have no particular skills ask a friend – you may be surprised by the response, because others sometimes see talents that you don't see.

**Wednesdays: Be compassionate.** It's easy (and understandable) to have compassion fatigue – we may feel that there is so much needing to be done for others that what **we** can offer is just a drop in the ocean. Remember what St David said – do the little things and remember that what we do for others we also do for God.

**Thursdays: Be honest.** No-one is a paragon of virtue. We are human and we make mistakes. We can't learn from those mistakes unless we admit them and forgive ourselves. It's liberating.

**Fridays: Let go.** Try not to hold a grudge or keep thinking about something said to you that was hurtful. If you feel able, why not tell that person calmly how hurt you feel? If you can't, try to forgive (which in itself is healing).

**Saturdays: Be loving.** Jesus told us to love one another as we are loved. He didn't say it would always be easy because people aren't always easy. I think he felt that we should try...

**Sundays: Feel peace.** Sometimes there is so much going on in our lives that it feels that there is no time to just simply be. Cultivate the habit of taking some time to have a quiet conversation with the Lord and feel 'the peace of God that passes all understanding'.

## The Work of Christian Aid

Over the coming months we will have various contributors looking at the work of the charities that we support across the Penhill Benefice. This month it is the work of Christian Aid.

Many of us support this charity as individuals, but it is also supported, by the Penhill Benefice throughout Lent, via the Christian Aid envelopes and through the Lent Soup lunches in *Carperby, Redmire, Thoraby and West Witton Villages*. (Please see further information on page 5).

As an organisation, Christian Aid, have existed for over 75 years, founded in 1945 when British and Irish churches sought to help refugees following the Second World War.

They now work in 37 countries, with people of all faiths and none, standing up for dignity, equality and justice, believing that voices and actions are stronger together.

They work with local partners and communities to fight injustice, respond to humanitarian emergencies, campaign for change, and help people claim the services and rights they are entitled to.

One of the countries they work in is South Sudan, where challenges seem never-ending, stories of hope shine brightly. Daniel Ayuen is the programme manager for at Smile Again Africa Development Organisation (SAADO) who works to bring hope and change to those struck by crisis. Daniel's personal journey is one of resilience determination and empathy. Born and raised in Kakuma refugee camp in Kenya where he spent 12 years, Daniel experienced the hardships of displacement firsthand. Today as programme manager for food security and livelihoods at SAADO, Daniel is transforming lives. He writes "I was born and raised a refugee in Kakuma camp, where I spent most of my childhood. I understand the struggles these people face because I lived them myself. It helps me connect with the refugees and give them hope that this situation isn't permanent.

### **Flourishing Families**

Some of you attended the Benefice Food for Thought Evening during Lent last year (2024) in Swinithwaite, when Richard and Liz Thomas spoke about the Flourishing Families initiative in Leeds helping the poorest families, through the schools across the city, in a variety of practical ways.

In November the Aysgarth PCC agreed to send a donation of £250. Geoff Hirst received a letter of thanks from Richard Colbrook, Trustee, in which he wrote: 'Last year we gave our poorest families a Christmas hamper which meant they had food on the table over the holidays. This year we plan to give each of their children a stocking to open on Christmas Day; a day which would otherwise be present-less for them.' Their original target was to feed 120 families, but the response from their supporters was so great they were able to feed around 170 families. We are asked to pass on heartfelt thanks to everyone in the Benefice who contributed, however indirectly.

### **JOURNEY WITH MAF**



It was 80 years ago when an RAF fighter pilot, Murray Kenyon, was convinced that planes could be used to reach the millions of people who lived impoverished and fearful in the world's most isolated places.

He recruited a few experienced and like-minded ex RAF personnel to found MAF – Mission Aviation Fellowship. In January 1948 pioneers Stuart King and Jack Hemmings took off from Croydon in a flimsy Gemini aircraft to survey parts of the African continent using little more than a map and a compass.

MAF's earliest African landings identified Sudan as a nation with great difficulties. Since the first airstrip was carved out in 1950, MAF planes have

been serving the country's poorest and remotest people except for the years when they were forced out because of civil war. On 9<sup>th</sup> July 2011 South Sudan became a new independent country with its capital in Juba. The problems of transport, climate and isolation remain. Roughly 60% of the country cannot be reached by road. MAF's planes based in Juba now reach the most isolated and poorest with the help, hope and healing they need to survive. The UN identified 5 million in urgent need of help including a million children with acute malnutrition.

MAF today flies into 56 airstrips in South Sudan carrying up to 6,000 passengers each year. It works with 173 partner organisations. South Sudan is a country the same size as France but has only 124 miles of paved road. The rest of the routes are potholed or muddy tracks and travellers are frequently attacked by bandits.

South Sudan's climate is very hot all the year round and most people do not have access to clean water so MAF partners with other organisations to provide boreholes for drinking water and sanitation schemes.

Malaria is a killer. 2 million cases are reported each year. Remote clinics can only keep running because MAF planes deliver medicines, doctors and volunteers to help the sick. Survivors of the civil war conflict are flown to Bor Hospital. Pastors are flown in to Aweil and Yida to train people in spiritual healing to help villagers recover from horrific trauma. MAF pilots assist with a broadcasting station near Tonj from which local people hear the Good News of Jesus in their own dialect.

Mission in South Sudan would not be possible without MAF, as its planes supply tons of relief cargo and personnel movement throughout the region. Norwegian MAF pilot, Elvind Lindtjorn made two trips in a Cessna Caravan aircraft to rescue 50 children, victims of the war, being cared for in an orphanage east of Juba. The orphanage was under attack again but with MAF ground crew working quickly with the pilot they brought the children to safety.

As MAF's work in South Sudan continues please remember to pray – for safety for pilots and for the MAF team and partners so that many more lives can be saved through MAF's work.
