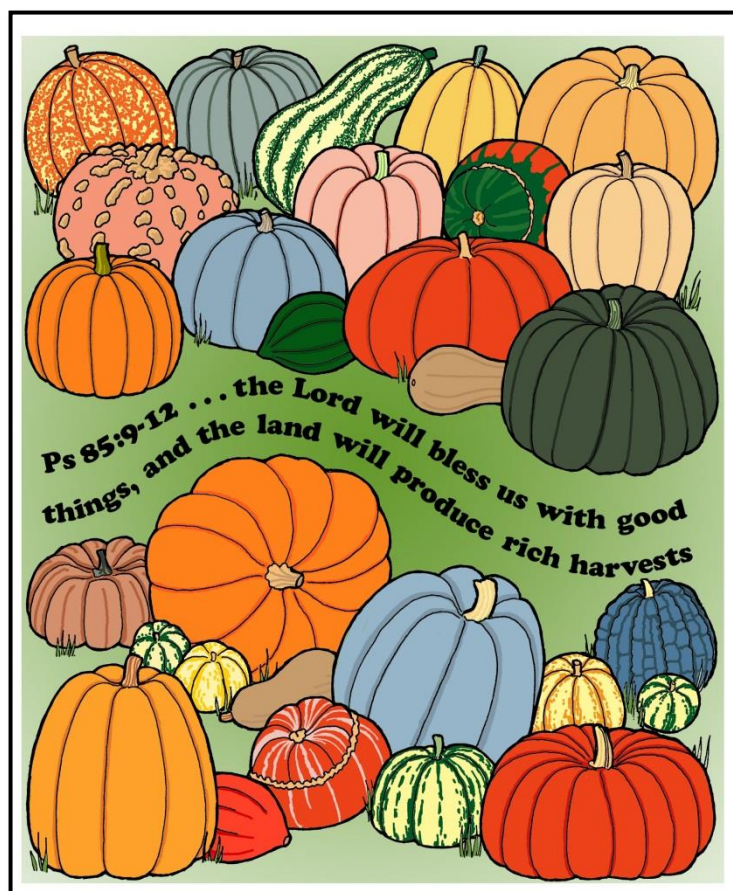

Vicar's Letter

Dear everyone,

At school, I'm afraid, I had little time for history.

I couldn't see the point of learning about the past. Perhaps unsurprisingly, the older I've become, the more I've become genuinely interested in where we have come from and what we can learn from the wisdom of previous generations.

Of course, our Christian history in the Dale is truly ancient. Saint Oswald's church in Castle Bolton is older than the castle, being built in the early 1300s. Saint Mary's church in Redmire is older still, and there is evidence of the Saxons building churches here in the 8th and 9th centuries as revealed, for example, by the stone cross stolen from Aysgarth in 1996; the carved cross inserted in the wall at Saint Bartholomew's, West Witton and archaeological finds in Wensley churchyard.

These put our own few decades here into some context even if our families have been here for generations. Think of all the years that people have grown up, lived, talked and learned from each other, watching the seasons progress year to year, walking the same paths and looking at the same hills that we do today!

This year the Christian Church worldwide marks an even older anniversary. Today we still affirm our faith at every communion service using the words of "The Creed"... a word taken from the Latin "Credo", meaning I believe. Strictly it is called the Nicene Creed, as there are two others also authorised in the prayer book.

It was formulated at an ecumenical (universal) Council called by the Emperor Constantine, and which met in Nicea in western Turkey in the year 325... meaning this year is the 1700th anniversary!

The Nicene Creed is still an excellent summary of the Christian faith. In just 226 words it declares our belief in God, and in Jesus – who, as true God was always with the Father, and by his descent, his life, death, resurrection and ascension enables us to have a restored relationship with God (salvation). We believe Jesus is returning in judgment at the close of the age, that he has sent the Holy Spirit, established his church, given us Baptism as a sign of our forgiveness and a hope in resurrection. Wow – that takes some digestion!

Because there is quite a lot of 'meat' there, the Church of England has produced some materials for small groups to use and chat through – and I shall be offering such an opportunity for a few weeks in October into November. The precise time and day will depend on who is interested, so get in touch to know more – and keep

an eye on the weekly pew sheet ... there are always some left at the back of church following the Sunday service.

The wisdom of the ancients, meeting together all those years ago, have left us a piece of work which still defines our faith and inspires our worship 1,700 years after it was commissioned!

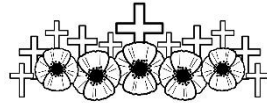

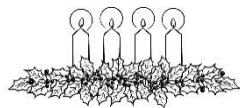

Remembering the 80th anniversaries of VE-Day & VJ-Day

Remembering these significant anniversaries has been a time for the nation to come together to mark the end of World War II and learn about the stories of those that served and the VE-Day generation. **West Witton had its own community lunch to mark VE-Day 80 in May; and as part of West Witton's Feast activities over the August bank holiday, St Bartholomew's church held an exhibition to commemorate the anniversaries.** People were invited to put together a piece of their relative's history. We got a terrific and varied response from their families wishing to do them some justice in a small way, acknowledging their courage, sacrifice and eventual victory in gaining the security, freedom and prosperity we have today.

Represented were from those serving in the Royal Artillery, RMP; the ATS; the Green Howards; the Middlesex Regiment; a Lincolnshire Regiment; Land Army girl in Coverdale; three Aycliffe Angels; Royal Navy and WRNS; RNVR Chaplain; RAC Officer, 4th Battalion Prince of Wales' Own Gurkha Rifles & 48th Indian Brigade, 17 Indian Infantry Division; and so very poignantly, Bombardier Percy Lindley, 125 Anti-Tank Regiment, Royal Artillery, stationed Malaya reported missing 15th February 1942 aged 27. Held prisoner in Camp 4 Thailand and made to work on Siam Burma railway. Returned home 13th October 1945, two months after VJ-Day.

A sample of ordinary young men and women deserving to be remembered; and from whose stories it is vital we learn and understand about the human cost of conflict, and ensure they are told to generations to come.

The Bishop of Leeds, the Rt Rev Nick Baines, preached at the United Penhill Benefice Service at St Bartholomew's, West Witton on Sunday 27th July, his final visit to a parish in the Leeds Diocese before he retires.

At the service he analysed more deeply the Lord's Prayer after telling the large congregation: 'In my life prayer has too often been what I have to say to God rather than listening to what God has to say to me. Because prayer is, in the end, the reshaping of our minds by exposure to God, so that we begin to see God, the world and us through His eyes.'

Rev Tom Ringland, vicar of Penhill Benefice, said: 'He encouraged us to stress the word "your" wherever it occurs in the Lord's Prayer.'



Bishop Nick and his wife, Linda, spent time with members of the congregation after the service while enjoying the refreshments provided in the village hall. He became the first Bishop of Leeds in 2014 and will retire on November 30.

He and his wife intend to return to live in his home city of Liverpool where she will continue her creative work as a glass artist and he plans to do more writing having had five books published already.

JOURNEY WITH MAF (Mission Aviation Fellowship)

When Jesus said in Acts 1 that we, His followers, would be a light “to the ends of the earth”, He certainly meant it when we come to our 4th destination with MAF, Papua New Guinea. It is a country with some of the most rugged, mysterious and inaccessible terrain on the planet. MAF will take you to some of those hidden places and bring light that will shine in their darkness.

Todd Aebischer is the Country Director and a pilot for MAF in Papua New Guinea (PNG). In his first nine months he piloted planes for medical evacuations, a worship crusade and co-ordinated response operations following a 7.5 magnitude earthquake. PNG is truly cut off from the outside world. MAF flights began as early as 1951 and quickly grew to become one of their largest operations but one which perfectly fit MAF’s God given vision to see remote and isolated people physically and spiritually transformed. Today thousands rely on MAF’s regular and dependable service to survive. By 1962 a new airstrip opened to Telefomin; 1997 prolonged drought caused death and starvation; 2015 the sweet potato crop in Highlands was decimated; 2018 PNG was shaken by powerful earthquakes and in 2020 there was the coronavirus pandemic. Throughout all of this MAF’s pilots and planes were there to bring relief.

Encased within dominating mountain ranges and dense forests MAF planes have landed on 168 airstrips, many terrifyingly cling to mountain ridges. In this extreme terrain there are fewer than 7.4 million inhabitants, mostly grouped in rural tribes speaking 832 different indigenous languages, making PNG the most linguistically diverse nation in the world.

However, diverse culture is not the greatest challenge. Across the entire country there are just 1,864 miles of paved road. 64% of the rural population

does not have access to clean water. Over the last 70 years MAF has been committed to sustaining communities. Flying crops to market, delivering building equipment, supporting teachers and schools, performing medical emergency evacuations and transforming villagers by connecting them to the outside world.

At Junkaral in the Highlands, villagers turned out with hand held tools and cleared a path through the forest for their first airstrip. Pilot Remi van Wermeskerken made the first landing and all the villagers turned out to greet the plane, decorating it with flowers. They carried the pilot on their shoulders in



praise as they realised they finally had planes that could bring them health care, education and contact with the world.

MAF staff member,

Nawi Mabo, took a wireless computer into his home village and set it up to provide access and training to all ages. The people showed overwhelming appreciation. Nawi said, “by helping others, our actions can bring Christ’s love.”

One of MAF’s missions in PNG has been to partner with Bible translation teams who spend years living among the isolated tribes to understand their language and culture. By this means they can translate the New Testament in a meaningful way.

Medical evacuation flights are frequent as no roads connect Highland communities to towns with hospitals. Thanks to MAF flights Area Health Patrols provide health care for more than 60 communities reaching 53,000 people across Western Province. Kompian District Hospital partners with MAF to reach

Yambaitok which has no health facilities at all. Indagen Clinic is run by 6 hardworking medics but they are often short of pure water and medical supplies. 200 patients each day come for treatments; vaccinations, surgery, anti-natal checks, cancer screening and health talks.

Wanakipa Primary School is located deep in the bush, surrounded by forest and raging rivers. The Headmaster, Howard Hungi, explains, “ If MAF wasn’t here, I believe that all education and services in Wanakipa would cease to operate.” Education flights represent one of the top three requests for MAF in PNG. Please pray for the pilots as they meet the needs by transporting students and teachers and delivering supplies, exam papers and building materials for new schools.

It is a season of change for MAF’s fleet in PNG as the P2 one of the Cessna 208 aircraft had to be retired after 16 years. Replacing the P2 are 3 new aircraft which will ensure that MAF can continue delivering help for many years to come. We pray for MAF’s work in Papua New Guinea and praise God for the generosity of MAF supporters for making this provision possible.

Papa God I ken blesim yu God bless you in Tok Pisin, the language most widely spoken in PNG. Our last destination will be in Asia where MAF’s help has been requested.
